**Senate Act 10-15**

**TO APPROPRIATE FUNDING FOR ASUH BUSINESS CARDS (101<sup>st</sup> Senate)**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT SENATE:**

**SECTION I. PURPOSE**

The Associated Students of the University of Hawai'i (ASUH), originally called the Associated Students of the College of Hawai'i, was chartered by the Board of Regents in 1912 to act as the student government representing all classified full-time undergraduate students. The purpose of this bill is to allocate funding for business cards for all ASUH Senate members during the 101<sup>st</sup> Senate.

The invoice for business cards was never received before the close of business on May 7<sup>th</sup>, 2014 and thus would need to come out of the budget of the 102<sup>nd</sup> Senate due to fiscal procedures. This invoice is from November 2013 for a total of \$422.28 for 37 packs of 100 business cards.

**SECTION II. APPROPRIATIONS**

A total of \$422.28 shall be appropriated from Senate Account #3325232 (University Programs, Services, and Support.)

**SECTION V.** The Treasurer is authorized to draw upon said account.

**SECTION VI.** This act shall take effect upon approval from the Senate.
