Asked General Senate what University Librarian could do for students

How do faculty/lecturers contact the library to set up arrangements on how to use the resources located in the library? Like the Hawaiian collection, for example?

You can definitely call us; Often we will reach out and we will do our best to tailor you as much as possible based on the resources you need pertaining to your research. You would just have to tell us what it is you are looking for.

Any plans regarding OERs in the library?

At this point, not particularly, we talked a little about it; One of the things we are trying to do is relate it. We have been working with some faculty where we are buying digital copies of books that have an unlimited user license. These are not your standard intro textbooks though, as most textbook publishers won't sell to libraries. If there are more tailored books that a faculty member wants to use in their classroom, we will try to look for a copy with unlimited uses so that it can be free. It's not necessarily an open educational resource, but it is reducing the cost of textbooks for students. As we can work with faculty and identify the textbooks that work, we use this as an approach to reduce textbook cost.

A couple years ago, your predecessor announced a couple changes to sinclair library--they wanted to cut the library hours by 36%. Eventually they had to block back the changes due to a lot of student concerns from asuh and others about conveying the importance of having a 24 hour study space for students. I was just wondering what your position was on the topic considering we are now seeing changes happening again. Will Hamilton Library implement the same "open 24 hours/5 days a week" as Sinclair Library, once the construction begins?

I'll tell you what I know at this point. It looks like they're planning to close Sinclair at the end of this academic year. There's already been talk with administration about Hamilton picking up the "24/5" hours, but we gotta figure out how we're going to pay for it. There's a lot of logistical stuff, but in March/April we'll renew our security contract, and if we're going to be picking up those hours then we will be renegotiating our contract. We certainly

understand the need for students' space. I totally support and understand the need for study space or just the need to get away from people.

In terms of when you take the students from Sinclair and put them in Hamilton, after this 24/5 space, the students coming from Sinlair and those in Hamilton are very different crowds. Hamilton has that environment where you go there to study, whereas Sinclair has more of that social element (look at their rules, you can eat in one but not in the other). So when Sinclair does close and those who study there get redirected to Hamilton, where do you see we can make both crowds coexist under one library?

There are ways to think about that where you can create zones, for example one particular floor can be more social than the other. I certainly understand not everyone studies or works with others the same way, so it may be an issue for us at first but we'll see what happens once people start showing up. My biggest concern would be the lack of space. Hamilton doesn't have as much space as Sinclair, so that will be one of the things I'll be thinking about this summer while we plan for that.

During the renovation of Sinclair, what happens to the programs that are currently housed there? Will they be rehoused?

The plan is to close the whole Sinclair Library so that everything can be finished within two years. I have no say in where the programs that are currently in there would be rehoused.

So what kind of other ways is the library thinking of engaging students, undergraduates AND graduates students, to use the library services?

I'll talk about graduate students first: long-term I'm looking at creating graduate student space in the library because they don't really have a space anywhere. I think in terms of outreach to students, one of the things I'm interested in doing is making the library a center of discourse so it's not just about studying but of lectures and people talking about difficult issues. I want to use it as a mechanism to interact with the different collections and services. I'm also trying to think of other events that need sponsoring and how the library can make connections to them.
